
Curriculum Focus

Reception



Reception have had a fabulous first full week at school. They have continued to familiarise themselves with class rules and routines and have adjusted well to their full days in class.

This week in literacy the children have loved retelling the story of Little Red Riding Hood. To help them recall the main events and characters they have made actions to accompany the story and






The children have been practising their counting in Maths with number songs. They have enjoyed acting out '5 little speckled frogs', '5 little ducks', '5 currant buns' and 'ten green bottles'. They have been using their fingers to represent numbers from 1-10.

Year One

In English this week, the children have been learning about different word classes. They have learnt about nouns and verbs and been generating those associated with the character 'The Lonely Beast' from our core text. The children have also learnt about what a suffix is and how it changes a root word to think of vocabulary to create a poem about the beast.





In maths this week the children have been continuing their learning of number bonds to 5 by working in a systematic way. They have also been working on their problem solving skills to find the missing parts by counting on to find the answer and recording equations.



In our wider curriculum, the children have been looking at the history of Croydon and discussed how things have changed. In science they have been discussing the materials that objects are made from and if they are appropriate.

Year Two

In Maths this week, Year 2 has been identifying numbers on a number line. They have also been learning about partitioning two-digit numbers into different combinations of tens and ones using dienes.

In English they have identified and generated a range of nouns, adjectives and verbs based on our core text 'Izzy Gizmo'. They were able to generate fantastic phrases and have particularly enjoyed demonstrating their actions to match the verbs.



In our wider curriculum, the children have identified and classified materials. They were able to use correct vocabulary and justify why they would use certain materials on certain objects.

Year Three

It has been another eventful week in year 3 as a wide variety of learning has taken place within every subject. In English this week the children have used their knowledge of this term's text "Hidden Figures" to write a fact file about one of the key characters to develop their understanding and awareness of the hardships and triumphs of ambitious African American

women in the 1950's.

Within Maths, the children have worked hard to grasp the concept of place value. Throughout the week they have cultivated their knowledge of finding 10 and a 100 more and 10 and a 100 less than any given number.



Within the wider curriculum, the children have enthusiastically participated in the mixed History/Geography lesson in which important locations throughout the



country of Egypt such as the River Nile was located and given historical context to what they have learnt in History.




In Science the children have learnt important facts and information about the structure of plants. This knowledge will keep them in good start for next week when they get the opportunity to plant their own seeds and watch them grow!

Year Four

In English this week the children have been writing, editing, and improving the language in their diary entry from the standpoint of Chaya, the lead character in the class text The Girl who Stole an Elephant by Nizrana Farook. They particularly enjoyed the challenge of "showing" rather than "telling" explicitly how Chaya was feeling in their writing. They finished the week analysing what makes an effective performance, before acting the scenes from the diary to each other in small groups.

In Maths they have been enthusiastically deepening their knowledge of Roman numerals as well as learning the new skill of rounding up or rounding down to the nearest 10 and nearest 100.

In Science, following on from our exploration of the playgrounds last week - where the children found grasshoppers, worms, woodlice, and a variety of plants! - they have been considering how living things can be grouped in a variety of different ways using scientific classification keys.



Year Five

Year 5, have worked exceptionally well this week! They've shown a hunger for learning that has been amazing to see and feed! As a result of this, the children have shown positive learning behaviours this week, which has allowed for an optimistic and engaging atmosphere.

In English they have been focusing on the use of fronted adverbials, prepositional language and subordinate clauses in the context of our core text 'The Boy and the Globe'. They have used some fantastic fronted adverbials to add more detail and information in order to help make their writing more interesting

In Maths, they have also worked hard to learn how negative and positive numbers work and use negative numbers in context. – Year 5 have found out that negative numbers are used in everyday life such as for the temperature of freezers etc.

Finally, In history children have also enjoyed learning about the Tudors and how Laws were put in place to help support the poor Tudors.



We have had a very busy week in Year6, with children sitting a number of mock tests, in preparation for our end-of-year SATS exams. They have written their first extensive writing task and conducted a very exciting Science experiment at Canterbury Hub. Well done everyone for your hard work, stamina, and perseverance!

In English, pupils have been writing a monologue in character based on our core text - Pig Heart Boy. They have focused on a number of cohesive devices such as synonyms, antonyms, repetition and adverbials of place and time, in order to weave their ideas throughout a number of paragraphs. Our young writers have shown great empathy with the main character and the challenges he faces, in order to create moving and eloquent monologues.

In addition, they have sat reading comprehension and SPAG (spelling, grammar and punctuation) mock exams.

In Maths, we have assessed their current attainment in arithmetic and reasoning. We have also spent some time revisiting and consolidating knowledge and practice on rounding and negative numbers.

Pupils at Canterbury have dissected lamb hearts in order to further their knowledge on the anatomy of the human heart by direct observation and comparison with that of a lmb. Children in Rosecourt Road will have the opportunity to do so next week. We are very lucky to have Mrs Angela working with us in Year 6. Mrs Angela has a Science background and years of research on the biology of the human heart. She will be carefully guiding us through this process next week.

Community

We are starting the application process for the Junior Leadership Team (JLT) members this week. Your children will come home this weekend with an application form. Please encourage them to fill this out as independently as possible and with as many ideas as they can think of for each question. They will need to hand this back to their class teacher by the end of Tuesday 27th September. These will then go to Miss Evans (the JLT staff facilitator) who will make a short list for each class based on their responses. The short list will then be voted on in each class to determine the class' JLT representative for the year. These votes will be aimed to be completed by Friday 30th September and so we hope to be able to announce the majority of our JLT the following week. Year 6 students will be applying to become Lead students and will have a slightly longer process that will be explained fully at a later date. They only need to complete the initial application form at this point.
