## **Curriculum Focus**



#### Reception

In reception this week, the children have been continuing to explore our core text 'The Squirrels who Squabbled'. They have been using their 5 senses to describe natural materials that they would find in the wood. They have been writing sentences such as 'The leaf is ....' and 'The moss is .....'.

In maths, the children have been learning about positional language, such as under, over, between, in front, next to, etc. The children then applied their knowledge to find the position of the shapes of a variety of pictures. Then they continued to collaborate and create their own 2D shape pictures and talk about the

In topic, we have been looking at their new artist for the half term. His name is Andy Goldsworthy and he creates sculpture



using natural

materials. The children are very excited to go on our trip to Coombe Woods next week, where they will be getting a first hand experience of the woods. They will be using their senses to describe the woodland and will collect natural materials to make their own Andy Goldsworthy inspired art.

#### Year One

In English this week Year 1 have been working hard to design and make their own posters to help save the oceans. They thought carefully about which important facts to include in their posters and looked at other posters to get ideas on how to make it eye-catching.



In maths we have been consolidating our place value knowledge of tens and ones. We started the week by looking at number lines and using them to help order numbers to 100. Later on we moved on to using the tens and ones values to help us



compare numbers. We used the greater than (>) and less than (<) symbols

to help record our answers.

In Science we have been continuing our learning about plants and trees. We went on a walk around the playground to see which trees we could identify from their leaves and fruit.

#### **Year Two**

In English this week, the children have been learning how to write a setting description based on the film they watched last week. Then they created their own gnomes considering a range of features and described its appearance and personality using adjectives. The children then used their year 2 writers toolkit to form sentences when writing a detailed character description.

In maths, the children have revisited previous learning and solved more complex problems. They identified missing numbers in a number sentence which required them to work out the inverse as a step to successfully solve the problem.




In the wider curriculum subject Geography, the children looked at a range of human features and created a key when identifying them on a map of the United Kingdom. As for Art, the children explored the work of an Artist 'Eric Carle'. They were thrilled when they found out he was the author and illustrator of The Very Hungry Caterpillar! They learnt about how he produced his work to create a collage and got creative with a range of resources.

#### **Year Three**

This week, year 3's have been working really hard to write their first ever playscript for Oliver Twist. As the children now understand the story of Oliver Twist, they were very excited about writing their own playscript. They did this through summarising the scene, adding in what each character will be saying and thinking about their feelings by adding stage directions.

In Maths the children have been busy completing their assessments for the term. They have persevered and completed all three maths papers. In addition to this, the children have been learning about different types of angles; acute, right and obtuse. They also learnt how to measure accurately using a ruler.

In the wider curriculum subjects, the children were excited to learn more about the artist Jean-Michel Basquiat. They found out who he was and explored his wonderful artwork in detail by understanding more about his skills.

the symbols of Buddhism. In science, the children wrote a set of instructions on how to conduct a fair test on forming shadows. Finally to end the week, the children took part in their annual sports day. This time it was held at the grounds of Archbishop Lanfranc Academy.

#### **Year Four**

It has been an extremely full-on week in year 4! The children have worked extremely hard on their summer term assessments, each day showing resilience, focus, and excellence - they should be extremely proud of themselves, as are all of us. Then, we travelled to Lanfranc Academy to compete in our annual Sports Day - it was lovely to see the children taking part and giving it their all in athletic competitions and games, not to mention enjoying the sunshine!

In English, the children have been further diving into our core text "The Boy at the Back of the Class." They have studied the features that go into writing an informal letter, which they have used to write their own informal letters, creating some gorgeous and engaging writing! In Maths, the children have been working on angles and turns and shown terrific understanding of the mechanics of the topic, which will continue into next week as we explore these and more in closer detail.

In Art, we have been studying the artist known as Alwy Fadhel, a refugee



who uses coffee to create his art. We looked at the messages and themes behind his work and the skill of using coffee to paint. The children then used his work and built upon it to create their own pieces of work, using coffee and charcoal, and it's safe to say that the results were incredible. I'm sure we are all looking forward to what they will create next!





#### **Year Five**

In English class, our talented writers in Year 5 have been diligently analysing descriptions of settings and applying the skills to their own writing. Students have proven their creativity and ability to use their five senses to create an atmosphere.

In maths class, the students have been exploring how to convert units of measurement. This unit began with a fun activity that required students to make and throw a paper aeroplane and find the distance by using a range of measurement units.

Sports day was a welcome inclusion in a busy testing week! The Year 5 students competed fairly in a range of fun games. Their effort and sportsmanship on such a hot day was a credit to themselves and the school!

#### **Year Six**

Year six have had a busy week taking part in lots of activities. We started on Monday with the first session to support children with the transition to secondary school- it was a great workshop and a chance for the children to share and discuss their worries and find out who to talk to about their concerns. The children have also been writing their end of year reflections which has been a great chance to think about everything they have accomplished this year. At Canterbury Road, the children have also started reading this term's core text: Trash by Andy Mulligan which tells the story of 3 children who live and work on a dumpsite and make a lucky discovery one day. The classes had their own trash which they sifted through to find items which they could 'sell' to make a few pennies. The children then reflected on the lives of the children who live in these places.

Sports day was a great success and we are so proud of how every child took part and showed our West Thornton values.
