Curriculum Focus

Reception

This week the children have met their new teacher and have been continuing to visit the year one classrooms to prepare for the transition in September.

In literacy this week, the children have been recalling key events they have taken part in throughout their time in reception. They have reflected on their most memorable events and have written a sentence about this. They have used conjunctions such as 'because' and 'and' to extend their sentences.











In Maths, the children have been revisiting addition and subtraction. They have been introduced to worded problems and have been analysing these to decide which operation to use. They have



been solving them using a variety of strategies, such as pictorial representations and concrete resources.

On Thursday the children enjoyed dressing in yellow and Red for Spanish day, where they learned to count, name the days of the week and taste the Spanish themed menu prepared by the kitchen.



Year One

What an exciting week we have had in year one!

In English we have been using our story plans to write our own stories based upon our core text 'Tidy'. We used our own story plans to change different aspects of the original text including the setting and character. We have worked hard to ensure our stories include all of the features we have been using in our learning.

In maths we have been learning about time. We investigated the difference between the units of time seconds, minutes and hours by carrying out a range of activities to decide which would be the best unit to use when completing each activity, this included star jumps, clapping our hands, writing numbers and saying the alphabet. We used analogue clocks to help us learn how to tell the time to the hour and the half hour.

In RE we brought our learning of Sikhism to an end with a visit to a local Gurdwara which is a place of worship. We followed the rules of covering our heads, removing our shoes and washing our hands as a sign of respect. We saw lots of artefacts that we had learnt about in class and we found out new information too! When we came back to

Gurdwara using the building blocks.

Year Two



Year 2 have had a busy week! As part of their learning journey, the children visited Coombe Woods. They were absolutely thrilled to be able to visit the

woods and explore the different habitats and animals that live there. They saw beautiful cabbage butterflies, dragonflies zipping around and little, grey squirrels as well as learning about identifying different tree species. They





also collected leaves, twigs and fallen petals to create mandalas.


In maths, the children have been carrying out a variety of maths investigations involving time, money and multiplication. One of the investigations asked children to consider the value of coins and what denominations would make the most amount of money and which would make the least when the number of coins were limited to five coins. Children also worked systematically to find out all the different combinations they could make.

In science, Year 2 are continuing to observe their experiments testing to see which conditions are best for a seed to grow. The children were shocked to see how quickly their seeds grew in soil! Some of the children commented on how their seed was barely visible in the morning and by the afternoon, it had grown considerably!

Year Three

As we approach the end of the term, the children in Year 3 have been performing different scenes by following their written play scripts. They have thoroughly enjoyed using facial expressions and putting their acting skills into practise. The children then had a real treat when they had a visit from a theatrical performing company; M & M Theatrical Productions.

In maths this week, the children have been consolidating their learning on the four operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They have been working on understanding more about formally how to word on a written method. The children consolidated their learning on carrying in addition and exchanging in subtraction. To get the children ready for year 4, it is vital that they learn their times tables.







In the wider curriculum areas, the children have been reflecting on their learning for the term. In geography, the children went through their learning on the features of a river and information on the major rivers of the world. They made links with other areas of the curriculum. In science the children recapped their knowledge and skills on the topic of 'Light'. They did this by discussing with their friends, what a light source was, recalling different light sources and discussing transparent, translucent and opaque objects. In art, the children were adding details to their background by looking closely at the art work by Jean-Michael Basquait.

The children also enjoyed Spanish day on Thursday. They got to wear red and yellow or a Spanish theme outfit, played games on Rockalingua, coloured in Spanish puzzles and enjoyed doing word searches.



Year Four

After many days of planning, Year 4 finally began writing Ahmet's prequel this week. They are posed to use all the fantastic figurative language they have been practising during their planning including astonishing adjectives and amazing alliteration, scintillating similes and marvellous metaphors. In grammar

for their writing the children have also been challenged to include correctly punctuated speech and semicolons in their work. They have all done so well at imagining making that long exhausting

journey from a war torn country across high mountains and treacherous oceans to seek safety.

In maths it has been all about variety this week in a whirlwind journey through some of the tricky concepts the children have covered this term including revising and consolidating their knowledge of telling the time, converting measurements from millimetres to



centimeters to meters and everything in between, including adding fractions more than a whole and finally rounding decimals!




In science the children have really enjoyed exploring what makes a food chain in science. They were amazed to realise that food chains start by green plants using energy from the sun to grow. They then relished researching and creating an information poster in small groups to describe their own food chain ending with a top predator.

Year Five


Year 5 have been working hard this week. They have been completing a variety of different assessment tests such as, maths arithmetic, maths reasoning papers, writing papers, reading papers etc in order to prepare them for their final year in primary school.....





During history this week we have been continuing our learning on the Anglo-Saxons, we have used laptops to research more information and then they created a poster with all the key information they found out.

During Art this week, we have been carving African patterns into polystyrene and then filling them with paint and using it to make print patterns to help create beautiful, cultural African art pieces. They used their knowledge from the previous lessons and mixed primary colours together to create secondary art. Their art work continues to be inspired by the famous artist Charis Tsevis.



Year 5 were able to meet their new teacher for year 6! This was an exciting time for both the children and the teachers! Exciting times ahead!



Finally, Thursday was Spanish day! We had a whole school outdoor assembly where we enjoyed some Spanish music, then in class we



completed some Spanish based activities and to finish it off, a special Spanish themed lunch! How delicious!
