

Curriculum Focus

Reception

This week in reception the children have had a focus on DT. As part of our core text 'Here We Are' a space baby came to visit the children to learn about planet Earth. To help the baby return home the children have been collaborating to make a rocket. They have learnt about the different parts of a rocket and have explored a range of materials to decide on their suitability for rocket building. The children have then designed their own rockets before collaborating in groups to make a rocket prototype.

To teach the baby about humans, In literacy we have been naming and locating body parts. The children had great fun working together to label a life size body template before using their phonic knowledge to listen for sounds in words and write their own labels using the sounds they hear.



In maths the children have been exploring shapes. They have been busy identifying circles and triangles and talking about each shape's properties. Children used their powers of observation during a shape hunt to identify circles and triangles in the environment.





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Year One

This week in year 1 the children have been rewriting the story of Little Red Riding Hood and using interesting adjectives to describe the characters and their actions. The children really enjoyed acting out their sentences before writing them.

In maths we have been revisiting the number bonds to and within 10. The children have had fun by doing this practically and then used this knowledge to complete this in their books.

All curriculum subjects have been fun and interactive. The children have learnt about human features in geography and really enjoyed looking at what the buildings around our local area were made out of. In science they explored how objects can be made from different materials such as, a spoon can be made from metal, plastic or wood.

Year Two

This week in Year 2 the children have been showing their teachers everything that they have learnt so far in Year 2 through their assessments. It has been great to see how much they already know and to see the children demonstrating the school value of resilience even when they have found some questions quite tricky.

In history they have been continuing to learn about the significant individuals the Wright brothers. They have also learnt about chronologically ordered events using dates. They applied this knowledge to create a timeline to explain the history of flight.

In science they have continued their learning about inventors and materials by learning about John McAdam and his invention of tarmac. They investigated the best material to create a road surface with and concluded that tarmac was the best as it allowed the car to travel the furthest.

Year Three

In Year 3 this week the children have shown great perseverance and resilience in completing their autumn assessments. The children were able to retrieve their previous learning and apply these to the questions. Well Done Year 3!



In geography the children have been looking at the different geographical features of the River Thames and the River Nile. They used the ipads to access Google Earth and looked for key features of the two rivers including the river source, tributaries and the river mouth. The children are really looking forward to applying this knowledge on their trip to London next week.



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During science the children enjoyed investigating how magnets repel and attract each other, applying this knowledge to a range of problems using scientific vocabulary.

Year Four

Year 4 have completed all their assessments this week and have now returned to their normal timetable. We are continuing our cross-curricular theme, with a focus on the impact of climate change. In English, the children evaluated Greta Thunberg's powerful speech to the United Nations, in 2019 entitled 'The world is waking up', and learnt about the features of effective speech writing, identifying the use of emotive language and repetition. In maths, the children used manipulatives to consolidate their learning on division and multiplication, with a focus on the 6- and 9-times tables. Next week the children will begin to look at efficient methods of calculation with a focus on the 12 times table.

In Geography this week, the children reviewed fact sheets on the impact of global warming on coral reefs, polar ice caps, and ocean currents. They used their summarising skills to create short fact files, applying their learning from last week. In science, the children learnt how to take accurate measurements using a thermometer, comparing different water temperatures. They also discussed the uses of thermometers in scientific research and the importance of measuring temperature changes in the environment.

Well done year 4, for completing an exciting week of learning.


Year Five

We've had so much fun this week! Having finished our assessments, this week we have been getting practical with both science and DT being used to explore!

In science, we have been continuing our theme of materials and their properties and have been analysing various objects to be able to identify their properties and then compare them. We have also been having fun looking at reversible and irreversible changes (covering the playground in fizzy drinks at the same time!).



In DT, we have been exploring the direct stitches we could use to decorate our final outcome. We are





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getting pretty good at hand sewing and are excited to start the design process next week!

English has seen us move away from diary entries and start to construct a 3rd person narrative using our core text as a basis. We have focused on taking the existing 1st person narrative and changing pronouns and sentence structure to make a cohesive 3rd person narrative.

In maths, we have been looking at number facts linked to multiplication and division. We started with multiples, moved on to factors and common factors and have just finished investigating prime numbers! We will continue this theme by looking at square and cube numbers next.

Year Six

Year six have had a fantastic week which has involved a mixture of assessment and excellent learning. The children used their assessments as a positive opportunity to show off their learning from the first 8 weeks of year 6. Well done to everyone. As well as this, children have also been recapping their learning on fractions by comparing, adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators. They remembered their learning from year 5 and were able to apply it by following the steps to success. In English, the children have applied the skills from the previous week to describe the setting, atmosphere and characters from our core text *Stella by Starlight*. They were able to manipulate language and sentence structure to convey the tense, sinister atmosphere of the forest where the action took place. In history, the children have been learning about civil rights in Britain in the 1960s. They learnt about the Race Relations Act, looking at life before and evaluating its impact. The discussions held in classes were extremely well articulated and children used the sources provided to great effect.

Reading recommendations

Arya in Acer recommends *Mysteries of Ravenstorm Island - The Lost Children* by Gillian Phillip. "When I started reading the book it felt like I was entering a world of magic and mythical creatures. I enjoyed watching the story happen as images in my mind. If you love adventure stories this is a great read and I can't wait to read the next book in the series."
