Spelling

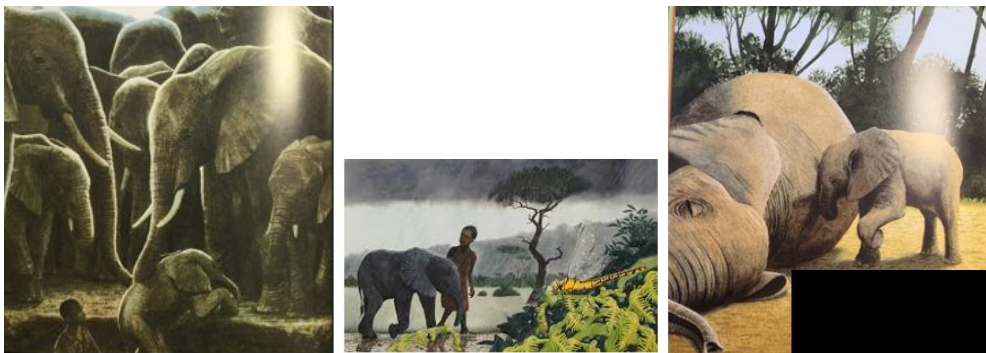
